

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky held in the Starlite Bowling Center on February 19, 1965 at 7:30 P. M., the following members of the Board were present:

Also present were W. E. Butcher, City Manager and O. T. Hinton, City Attorney.

Kermit Sexton made the motion to authorize the City Attorney to represent the City and defend the action instituted in the Pike Circuit Court by Hubert Maynard. The motion was seconded by Frederick W. Baker and upon roll call the vote was as follows:

The motion was carried.

A committee from The Pike County Chamber of Commerce, with attorney Lon Rogers as the spokesman, appeared before the commission and requested an appropriation in the amount of \$600.00 for Tourist Promotion to be put into a matching fund program and held in escrow until the funds can be matched by State funds. The Chamber of Commerce will put \$600.00 into the matching fund and it is hoped that the \$600.00 will be raised from community contributions, stated Rogers. He also stated that this would amount to \$1,800.00 which would meet the local goal.

Ulan Taylor made the motion to appropriate \$600.00 to Burl Spurlock, treasurer Kentucky Highland, Region 12, Tourist Matching Fund Program, to be held in escrow until all the funds are matched for tourist promotion. The motion was seconded by Kermit Sexton and upon roll call the vote was as follows:

A letter was presented to the Commission from Mr. Charles E. Spears, Superintendent of Pikeville City School, stating that on February 16th, 1965, the Pikeville Independent Board of Education rejected all bids for constructing and equipping the Pikeville Elementary School Building, and that the architect is revising plans and that bids will be requested again about May 1, 1965. There upon Uhlan Taylor made the motion that the city formerly reject the construction and equipment bids on the Pikeville Elementary School Building. Harry Hobson seconded the motion and upon roll call the vote was as follows:
