

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky held in the Starlite Bowling Center on February 18, 1966 at 7:30 p.m. The following were present.

Also present were City Manager W.E. Butcher and City Attorney O.T. Hinton.

Jack Trimble made a motion that the Mayor shall appoint a traffic flow and parking committee to confer with representatives of Merchants and Chamber of Commerce to make surveys and report their recommendations to the next regular meeting to meet the problems presently existing, and that Ayers Shortt be authorized to cooperate with and assist the committee and see that this Committee functions and reports. Warren Keene seconded the motion and upon roll call the vote was as follows:

The following resolution was offered.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it appears that a heavy duty two-way traffic bridge is greatly needed over the Big Sandy River at a point on United States Highway No. 23 leading to the bottom land just below what is known as the Keel Addition giving access to the territory where the airport is now operated, and

WHEREAS, it appears that the development of such an bridge would be essential to the development of a prime industrial area in that territory consisting of about 400 acres of bottom land of which 102 acres are already committed to that use, and

WHEREAS, it appears that the development of such an industrial area is sorely needed and essential to the growth and development of the City of Pikeville.,

Now, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Mayor be authorized and directed to negotiate with the Department of Highways of the State of Kentucky and the officials of the Federal Appalachian Regional Commission looking to the construction of such a bridge and to commit to the City of Pikeville to co-operate with these governmental agencies and participate in the cost of such bridge construction as far as it is financially able to do so under existing law.

Harry Hobson Commissioner moved the adoption of this resolution. Warren Keene Commissioner seconded the motion.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it appears that Dan Vanhooose died on the 13 day of January, 1966 at which time he was employed as a regular member of the Police Force of the City of Pikeville and had accumulated a sufficient time to entitle him to a two-weeks vacation with pay and,

WHEREAS, it further appears that Dan Vanhooose had been a regular, faithful, and efficient officer for many years.

Now, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the City Manager be authorized and directed to pay to the estate of Dan Vanhooose the equivalent to two-weeks pay in lieu of the two-weeks vacation with pay to which he was entitled at the time he died.
