RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE

The Mayor announced that the following notice had been published in the PIKE COUNTY NEWS in the issue of March 3rd, 1966, to-wit:

"NOTICE OF MEETING OF CITY COMMISSIONERS TO CONSIDER ADOPTION OF CERTAIN
BUILDING CODES

All persons interested will take notice that at a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville to be held at the Starlite Bowling Center in the City of Pikeville on Friday, March 18th, at 7:30 p.m., the Board will consider the adoption and approval of certain codes governing buildings, plumbing, electrical, and gas installations and housing generally by reference to the codes promulgated and published by (1) the Southern Building Code Congress, designated as Southern Standard Building Code 1965 Edition, (2) the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, of New York City, designated as American Standard-National Plumbing Code, and (3) by the National Fire Protection Association of Boston, Massachusetts, designated as National Electrical Code 1965.

This notice is given pursuant to the provisions of the Kentucky Revised Statutes 282.080 and eKentucky Revised Statutes 86.160 and other applicable laws.

All citizens and persons owning property within the City limits of the City of Pikeville are invited to attend said meeting and to participate in the considerations above mentioned.

The general discussion of the various codes mentioned in the Notice was held and the following Resolution was offered.

RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville adopt and approve the following codes which shall hereafter govern and apply to all buildings, plumbing, electrical and gas installation and housing generally within the City limits of the City of Pikeville from and after the adoption of this Resolution, to-wit: (1) Southern Standard Building Code, 1965 Edition published by Southern Building Code Congress of 1116 Brown-Marks Building, Birmingham, Alabama, with all revisions and changes officially approved at annual congress, as now published and asmmayhhereafter be adopted and published. (2) The National Plumbing Code, published by the American Society of Mechanical Engineers of 345 East Forty-Seventh Street, New York, New York, identified as ASA-A40.8-1955 UDC-69 6.1.001.3, Chapter 1-14 and all appendices as now published or which may hereafter be adopted and published. (3) National Electrical Code 1965 published by the National Fire Protection Association of Battermarch Street, Boston, Massachusetts, identified as NFPA No. 70 ASA-CL\_ 1965 together with all appendices as now published or which may hereafter be lawfully adopted and published.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each of the above mentioned codes be kept on file in the office of the City Clerk and made available for inspection by any resident or owner of property within the City at any time during business hours and that each of said codes be adopted and approved by reference without further publications as provided by Kentucky Revised Statutes 82.080 and under and pursuant to the authority vested in the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville by Kentucky Revised Statutes 86.160 and other applicable laws.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall supplement and amend the resolution of March 12th, 1964 in which former editions of these and other codes were adopted which shall continue in full force and effect except as hereby amended and supplemented by bringing these codes up-to-date so as to include current revisions and editions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager be and is hereby authorized and directed to require any person or concern contemplating the erection of any new building or structure within the City limits of the City of Pikeville to apply for and Obtain a building permit upon forms to be provided by him, in which such owner shall agree to conform to the building codes and other provisions of this Resolution.

IT IS RESOLVED FURTHER that this Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its adoption.

Hinton, announced that he had negotiated a settlement of the case of George Rich vs. City of Pikeville, being Action No. 8115 on the Civil Docket of Division No. Two of the Pike Circuit ourt, byywhich the City was to pay the sum of \$700.00 plus Court costs in full settlement of the claim.

The City Attorney presented the following resolution.

#### RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED that WHEREAS, there is an action pending in the Pike Circuit Court entitled "George Rich vs: City of Pikeville" being Action No. 8115 on the Civil Docket of The Second Division Court, in which the plaintiff seeks to recover damages to his household furniture and dwelling house situated on Garred Street in Pikeville which damage was occasioned by flooding, which was the result of some obstruction in the sewer line leading to Cline Street in July of 1961, and

WHEREAS, this claim has been pending for more than five (5) years, and

WHEREAS, the City Attorney has investigated the facts and has determined that the insurance carried by the City at that time did not cover liability for the maintenance of this sewer line, and is of the opinion that the plaintiff would be entitled to recover and that the damages are substantial and would probably be in excess of the amount offered in the settlement and has therefore recommended the acceptance of the offer of \$700.00 to settle the case.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premeises, BE IT RESOLVED that the C City Manager and City Attorney be authorized and directed to settle this case on the basis mentioned, and theucityoManager and City Clerk are authorized and directed to have checks issued to George Rich and Marris Allen May and John Paul Runyon, Attorneys, for the sum of \$700.00, and to Claude Reed, Clerk of the Pike Circuit Court, for the cost bill to be verified and approved by the City "ttorney.

#### RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED that WHEREAS F.S. Huffman, City Treasurer, has tendered his resignation, effective June 30th, 1966, and

WHEREAS the City Manager has recommended the appointment of Mr. Ray Burke to succeed him, and

WHEREAS, the City Attorney has advised that it would be advisable to defer transferring the dutied of the office from the present City Treasurer to the newly appointed City Treasurer until the enddof the fiscal period ending June 30th, 1966, after an addit of his records can be made, and that it would be impossible to get such an audit made by competent accountant until after April 15th and it is therefore recommended that the transfer be deferred until June 30th.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the tendered resignation of Mr. F.S. Huffman, dated March 9th, be accepted, and that Mr. Ray Burke, his successor, be appointed and directed to take over the office as of July 1st, 1966.
