MINUTES CITY OF PIKEVILLE

RESOLUTION NO. I

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NEED TO CREATE AND CREATING THE PIKEVILLE MUNCIPAL HOUSING COMMISSION.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE , KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky hereby determines, finds and delares that:

- 1. Unsanitary and unsafe inhabited dwelling accommodations exist in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky; and
- 2. There is a shortage of safe and sanitary dwelling accommodations in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky available to families of low income at rentals they can afford; and
- 3. These conditions can be best remedied through the exercise by the Pikeville Muncipal Housing Commissione of its powers within territorial boundaries of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky.

Section 2 There is need for a housing commission to be created for the City of Pikeville, Kentucky; and a housing commission is hereby created for the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, which shall be named the "Pikeville Muncipal Housing Commission", pursuant to KRS 80.020.

Section 3. This resolution shall be effective immediately.

Mr. Jack Trimble moved that all rules and by laws which otherwise prevent the adoption of said resolution at this meeting be suspended. Mr. Warren Keene seconded the motion and a vote was taken on said motion, the "Ayes" and Nays were as follows:
