JUDGMENT

EX PARTE

This cause coming on for hearing upon the motion of the City of Pikeville for judgment of annexation to which there was no objection and it appearing that no resident of the area proposed to be annexed or other person or concern interested therein have filed any protest, objection or other pleading herein and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the City of Pikeville acting by and through its duly elected, qualified and acting Board of Commissioners enacted an ordinance on April 4, 1966, extending its city limits to embrace the territory described in the Petition situated on Ferguson Creek and adjacent to the then city limits of the City of Pikeville which ordinance was duly advertised for more than thirty (30) days in the Pike County News, a newspaper of general circulation published in Pikeville, Pike County, Kentucky, as required by law and that the territory proposed to be annexed is accurately described by metes and bounds as set forth in said ordinance and in the Petition above mentioned and that the City of Pikeville has complied with all of the provisions of law required of it with respect to the annexation of said territory, it is now ordered and adjudged that the proposed annexation is hereby approved and confirmed. The territory annexed as aforesaid is described as follows:

Beginning on the City Limits of Pikeville on a knob between Ratliff Creek and Ferguson Creek; thence up the ridge between said creeks N 42° 50' E 1,000 feet more or less; N 88° 15' E 1,500 feet more or less to the top of a knob between Ratliff Creek and Ferguson Creek, thence down a spur toward the forks of Ferguson Creek S 2° 00' W 1,500 feet to the top of the spur; thence S 58° 00' E 1,500 feet more or less to the mouth of Williamss Branch; thence up the south side of the hill S 17° 00' E 1,500 feet more or less to the top of the ridge between Ferguson Creek and Peter Fork of Lower Chloe Creek; thence with the ridge between said creeks S 26° 00' W 750 feet more or less, S 72° 00' W 700 feet more or less S 48° 30' W 450 feet more or less; S 87° 00' W 600 feet more or less to the City Limits of Pikeville on a knob between Ferguson Creek and Lower Chloe Creek; Thence in a westerly direction with the present City Limits as extended by annexation ordinance of April 9th, 1965, pursuant to judgment of the Pike Circuit Court entered in an action therein pending entitled "Pike Circuit Court, Division No. One, Action No. 7742, entitled City of Pikeville, Ex Parte", to the point of beginning.

It is further adjudged that this annexation is and will be for the best interest of the City of Pikeville and will cause no material injury to the owners of the real estate within the territory proposed to be annexed and that a majority, if not all, of the resident voters and owners of real estate within said territory desire such annexation and will be benefitted thereby.
