I hereby acknowledge receipt of copy of the foregoing Notice of Special Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky to be held May 5, 1969 at 7:30 P.M. at City Hall in Pikeville, Kentucky.

The following resolution was presented to the Commission:

RESOLUTION REQUESTING KENTUCKY DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAYS TO DEFER ACTION ON APPALACHIA CORRIDOR B, U.S. ROUTE 23, UNTIL ENGINEERING IS COMPLETED AND THAT KENTUCKY PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT OFFICE AND UNITED STATES ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS COORDINATE ACTIVITIES OF PARTICIPATING AGENCIES.

WHEREAS, the City of Pikeville, by and through its Urban Renewal and Community Development Agency, is in the process of planning an Urban Renewal Project, known as the C & O Railway Urban Renewal Area Project Number Ky. R-72, which includes the relocation of the railroad from its present location to a cut through the mountain on west side of City of Pikeville and the feasibility of such relocation having heretofore been established and the Department of Housing and Urban Development having allocated funds therefor,

WHEREAS, there have been considerable studies made to determine the feasibility of including therewith also the relocation of proposed Appalachia Highway and the Levisa Fork of the Big Sandy River, and such studies determine that the relocation of said highway and river is feasible,

WHEREAS, it further appears that it would be most advantageous to the City of Pikeville and its residents that said river and highway also be relocated through the mountain along with the railroad,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville as follows:

1. That the Dept. of Highways for the Commonwealth of Ky. defer any further action on Rt. 23, Appalachia Corridor B within the City of Pikeville until engineering can be completed on the proposed open cut west of the City of Pikeville.
2. That the Kentucky Program Development office of Frankfort, Ky., is hereby requested to arrange for the necessary funding for costs of engineering seminars on the proposed open cut and further to coordinate the activities of all participating parties in said seminars.
3. That the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers are hereby requested to participate in and make any necessary studies for the proposed open cut and further to assume the responsibility for coordinating the activities of all federal agencies participating in said proposed open cut.
