The following Resolution was introduced by Mayor Hambley, read in full and considered:

RESOLUTION APPROVING APPLICATION FOR LOW-RENT HOUSING

WHEREAS: it is the policy of this locality to eliminate substandard and other inadequate, housing, to prevent the spread of slums and blight, and to realize as soon as feasible the goal of a decent home in a suitable living environment for all of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the United States housing Act of 1937, as amended, the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA (herein called the "Government") is authorized to provide financial assistance to local public housing agencies for undertaking and carrying out preliminary planning of low-rent housing projects and financial assistance in providing low-rent housing by leasing dwelling units in existing privately-owned structures, that will assist in meeting this goal; and

WHEREAS, the Act provides that there shall be local determination of need for low-rent housing to meet needs not being adequately met by private enterprise and that the Government shall not make any contract with a public housing agency for preliminary loans for surveys and planning in respect to any low-rent housing projects unless the governing body of the locality involved has by resolution approved the application of the public housing agency for such preliminary loan; and

MINUTES CITY OF PIKEVILLE

WHEREAS, the Pikeville Municipal Housing Commission(herein called the "Local Authority") is a public housing agency and is applying to the Government for low-rent housing.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, as follows:

- 1. There exists in the City of Pikeville a need for such low-rent housing at rents within the means of low-income families.
- 2. The application of the Local Authority to the Government for a preliminary loan in an amount not to exceed \$40,000.00 for surveys and planning in connection with low-rent housing projects of not to exceed approximately 200 (elderly) dwelling units is hereby approved.

Kermit Sexton moved that all rules of the procedure for the Board of Commissioners which, unless suspended, would prevent the final passage and adoption of said Resolution at this meeting be and the same are hereby suspended for the purpose of permitting the construction, adoption, and final passage of said Resolution at this meeting and that unamimous consent of all members present be given for the immediate consideration of said Resolution. The Motion was seconded by Warren Keene . The question being put as to the adoption of said Motion, the suspension of such rules and the given of unanimious consent to the consideration thereof, the roll was called with the following results:
