RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE AND IN BEHALF OF THE CITY DEMONSTRATION AGENCY PIKEVILLE MODEL CITY AGENCY TO CONTRACT WITH THE EASTERN KENTUCKY CONCENTRATED EMPLOYMENT TO TRAIN THIRTY-TWO DISADVANTAGED PEOPLE IN THE FOUR BASIC BUILDING TRADES.

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Pikeville hereby recommends, by official action, that the City of Pikeville for and in behalf of the City Demonstration Agency, contract with Eastern Kentucky Concentrated Employment to train thirty-two disadvantaged people in the four basic building trades.

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Pikeville hereby recommends by official action that the Mayor of the City of Pikeville William C. Hambley, should be authorized to subscribe and execute this contract for the City of Pikeville,

WHEREAS, the City Demonstration Agency is to pay Eastern Kentucky Concentrated Employment the amount of Thirty-Thousand (30,000.00) Dollars to constitute full and complete compensation.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE.

1. that the City of Pikeville, for and in behalf of the City Demonstration Agency, is hereby authorized to contract with Eastern Kentucky Concentrated Employment to train thirty-two disadvantaged people in the four basic building trades.

2. that the Mayor of the City of Pikeville, William C. Hambley, should and is hereby authorized to subscribe and execute this contract for the City of Pikeville.

3. that the City Demonstration Agency is authorized to pay Eastern Kentucky Concentrated Employment the amount of Thirty-Thousand (30,000.00) Dollars to constitute full and complete compensation.

WHEREAS, the Research and Development Office of Morehead University shall deliver these services, Pikeville College will act as an agent, and will receive no remuneration for same,

WHEREAS, it is further recommended by the City Commission of the City of Pikeville, that the total compensation and reimbursement to be paid hereunder shall not exceed Nine Hundred (\$900.00) Dollars.

3. that the total compensation and reimbursement to be paid hereunder shall not exceed Nine Hundred (900.00) Dollars,

4. that the Director of the City Demonstration Agency, William Turner, Jr., is hereby authorized to subscribe and execute the above-mentioned contract for the City Demonstration Agency.
