You are hereby notified that the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville Kentucky is called to meet in special session at 7:30 P.M. on Friday April 24, 1970 at City Hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky for the following purposes.

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE AND E.S. PRESTON AND ASSOCIATES, L.T.D. FOR THE EXPENSE OF ADVANCED PLANNING.

WHEREAS, the City Commission for the City of Pikeville hereby recommends, by official action, that the Contract, attached hereto and made a part hereof as Item "A", between the City of Pikeville and E.S. Preston and Associates, L.T.D., for advanced planning for relocation of the Levisa Fork of the Big Sandy River, the C. & O. Railway and US Route 23, to be approved that the Mayor of the City of Pikeville, William C. Hambley be authorized to subscribe and execute this attached Contract for and in behalf of the City of Pikeville.

The Mayor Declared the Resolution adopted.

The floor was opened for discussion by the public, which began with the discussion of Mr. Jones from the Fairview Addition who complained about the neighbors blocking the driveway and his place of business, commissioners asked City Manager, Ike Hall, to check into the matter there was some discussion to draw up a Resolution for No Parking of this street.

The Mayor presented and read the following Ordinance.

ORDINANCE CLOSING THOSE PORTIONS OF MAPLE STREET AND WALNUT STREET AND TWO 15 ALLEYS THAT LIE TO THE NORTH OF CHESTNUT STREET IN THE HUFFMAN BROTHERS SUBDIVISION LOCATED IN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Pike County Board of Education of Pike County Kentucky are the owners of Lots Nos. 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13, of Block No. 1 and lots Nos. 6 through 18 of Block 3 and Lots Nos. 1, through 8 of Block 5 of the Huffman Brothers Subdivision in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky and the said Board of Education has erected various improvements thereon,

WHEREAS, the hereinafter-described portions of Maple and Walnut Streets and two 15 foot alleys lying to the north of Chestnut and in said Subdivision separate and lie between certain of the aforesaid lots, but said streets have never been open to or developed and used as public ways and the Pike County Board of Education has erected certain improvements on portions thereof and the said Pike County Board of Education has requested the closing of those portions of Maple and Walnut Streets and two 15-foot alleys as hereinafter-described.

WHEREAS, the Pike County Board of Education has agreed to assume the burden of and pay all expenses and costs of closing of said portions of said, streets.

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest that those portions of the hereinafter-described Maple and Walnut Streets and two 15 foot alleys should be permanently closed and discontinued as dedicated or public streets and ways,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioner of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky does, ordain as follows:



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**SECTION I:** That those portions of the 15 foot alley lying to the north of Chestnut Street bordered on the east by Lots Nos. 6, 7, and 8 of Block 1 and on the west by Lots Nos., 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13, of Block 1 that portion of Maple Street that lies to the north of Chestnut Street and bordered on the east by Lots Nos 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13 of Block 1 and on the west by Lots Nos, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11, of Block 3; and that the portion of the 15 foot alley that lies to the North of Chestnut Street as bordered on the east by Lots Nos. 6 through 11 of Block 3 and lots Nos. 12, through 18 of Block 3 and that portion of Walnut Street that lies to the north of Chestnut Street that is bordered on the east by Lots Nos. 12 through 18 of Block 3 and on the west by Lots Nos. 1 through 8 of Block 5 be and the same are hereby closed and discontinued as dedicated or public streets and ways and with said portions of said streets being closed hereby being more definitely described as follows:

15 foot alley 117 feet west of Highway right of way said alley beginning on north right of way line of Chestnut Street 117 feet west of U.S. Highway right of way line; thence down river in a northerly direction 180 feet, more or less, to property line of Bruce Walters Ford Sales. Said alley being 15 feet wide.

## MAPLE STREET

Beginning on north right of way line of Chestnut Street 242 feet south west of highway right of way thence running down river in a northerly direction 236 feet more or less to property line of Bruce Walters Ford Sales said street being 35 feet wide.

## 15 Foot Alley

BEGINNING on north right of way line of Chestnut Street 367 feet southwest of highway right of way line; thence running down river in a northerly direction 291 feet, more or less to property line of Bruce Walters Ford Sales. Said alley being 15 feet wide.

## WALNUT STREET

Beginning on north right of way of Chestnut Street 473 feet southwest of highway right of way; thence running down river in a northerly direction 344 feet, more or less to property of Bruce Walters Ford Sales Being a street 35 feet wide as shown on Huffman Bros. Sub-division map.

**SECTION II :** That the City Attorney or his lawful successor is hereby authorized and directed to institute a civil action in the Pike Circuit Court as required by KRS 94.360 to effect the closing of said portions of the aforesaid streets and ways and he is hereby authorized and directed to institute such action and prosecute same to a final conclusion, including an appeal to the Court of Appeals of Kentucky if such appeal is deemed advisable or if one is taken by any party thereto.

**SECTION III :** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect when passed signed published and recorded by law and finally enforceable when the requirements of KRS 94.360 have been complied with.
