A RESOLUTION APPOINTING FIVE MEMBERS TO THE YOUTH GOVERNMENT BOARD:

The City Commission of the City of Pikeville deem it advisable that Five Members should be appointed to the Youth Government Board.

That the Mayor of the City of Pikeville, William C. Hambley, M.D. should be authorized to make said appointments.

WHEREAS, the City of Pikeville, Pike County Kentucky has executed a corporate agreement with the Department of Hud to furnish water and sewer service to housing projects developed within the city limits of Pikeville.

Whereas, the City Commissioners of the City of Pikeville hereby recommend, that the City of Pikeville commit itself to supply water and sewer service to the Methodist Housing Project on Chole Creek, Pikeville, Pike County, Kentucky, when said project is completed.

The City Commissioners of the City of Pikeville deem it advisable to do a study of traffic conditions on Ferguson Creek within the corporate limits of Pikeville Pike County Kentucky in order that hazardous driving conditions may be alleviated in said areas.

The Commissioners further deem it advisable that since the County Fiscal Court has moved certain federal programs to Ferguson Creek and housed the same on Ferguson Creek, prior traffic regulations are not sufficient to control the congestion caused by this relocation.

WHEREFORE THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE HERE BY RESOLVE:

That the City of Pikeville hereby requests that the Highway Department establish a 45 MPH speed limit on U.S. 119 from the Piggly-Wiggly Store to the foot of Town Mountain within the Corporate Limits of Pikeville, Pike County Kentucky at Pikeville, this the 31 st day of July 1970.
