Mayor Hambley asked Mr. Hutchinson whose ideal was it to strike, and he replied that the men were put to a secret ballot of vote and all voted to strike that he didnot encourage them to come out on strike.

Motion was then made by Warren Keene to pay Invoices for the amount of \$30,651.10 for Model Cities Demonstration Agency. this was seconded by Frank Justice and upon roll call the vote was as follows.

A RESOLUTION TO REQUEST THE NATIONAL GUARD AID THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE IN MEETING THE STATE OF EMERGENCY EXISTING DUE TO THE GARBAGE SITUATION AND RESULTING HEALTH HAZARD.

WHEREAS, the Health Department has declared a state of emergency as a result of sanitary conditions within the City of Pikeville.

Whereas, the City Commissioners deem it advisable that the above state of emergency should be met by the City of Pikeville requesting the National Guard to aid in alleviating this condition.

Therefore the City Commission of the City of Pikeville hereby resolve.

(1) that the City of Pikeville hereby formally request th at the National Guard aid the City of Pikeville to alleviate the existing state of emergency caused by accululation of garbage.

(2) that a state of emergency exists: therefore, this resolution shall be in full force and effect upon subscription and approval by these Commissioners.

The floor was opened to the public for discussion, employees that were on strike voiced their opinion about the strike and they also brought to the Mayor and Commissioners attention some problems which were unknown.

The Mayor made the statement to the employees that it had been a policy of the City, that if there was some problem, the employee should take the matter to his supervisor and if it couldn't be solved there, he would go to the City Manager, if there were no results here, they should bring it before the Commission and the Mayor for help. Some of the employees said that they were not aware of this policy. The employees stated that they wanted recognition, there was no comment from the Commission or the Mayor.

City Attorney John Cline III presented to the Mayor the following Resolution entitled as:
A RESOLUTION COMMITTING THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE TO A FIRM POLICY NOT TO TERMINATE THE EMPLOYMENT OF ANY AND ALL CITY EMPLOYEES PRESENTLY ON STRIKE IF SAID EMPLOYEES RETURN TO WORK WITHIN ONE WEEK FROM THE DATE OF THIS RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the City Commissioners of the City of Pikeville deem it advisable to commit itself to a firm policy not to fire any city employee presently on strike due to any union affiliation or picketing.

Therefore the City Commissioners of the City of Pikeville hereby resolve (1) that no city employees employment shall be terminated due to a present Union affiliation or picketing if said employee return to work within one week from the effective date of this Resolution.

(2) that an emergency exists therefore this Resolution shall be effective upon subscription and approval by this Commission.
