At that time I told him, and have told Mayor Hambley, they must find another place because the Health Department has advised us as well as the City of Pikeville could be held legally libel for the condition of the dump and the manner in which it is kept.

We have come to a definite conclusion that you must vacate the property by January 1, 1973, and that you send us a check now for two years rent at \$50 a month. This letter is official notice the dump must be moved by January 1, 1973, as we do not intend to continue to have it on our property.
