**EASEMENT**

THIS EASEMENT made and entered into this 9th day of November, 1973, by and between JOHN S. CLINE, JR. and MARGIE CLINE, his wife, parties of the first part, and THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY, a municipal corporation, party of the second part.

**W-I-T-N-E-S-S-E-T-H:**

That for and consideration of \$2,932.00 in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties of the first part do hereby grant unto the party of the second part, its successors and assigns, the right and easement to lay, maintain, operate, repair and remove a gas pipe line over and through the following described property, to-wit:

Being an easement running across the John S. Cline, Jr. property in Pikeville, Kentucky, a portion of which is adjacent to Jefferson Street and running parallel with a four (4) inch gas line which is already located upon said property and running from the John S. Cline gas well to the George Hames gas well.

Provided, however, all damages to fences and sidewalks caused by laying, operating or removing said pipe line shall be paid by the party of the second part.
