Dear Ayers:

At our last City Council Meeting it was agreed that Mr. John Greer and Mr. Bill Williamson would meet with us in regard to a possible settlement of the water damage suffered as a result of a meter failure. Since then I have been in contact with these parties.

Mr. Greer informs me that he is willing to accept the amount of the insurance adjuster's report, which I would recommend that we approve.

Mr. Williamson and I have gone over the figures supplied by him and the amounts set by the adjuster and arrived at the following conclusion:

As to Williamson Brothers T. V. and Appliance Company, Mr. Williamson originally claimed \$838.13 in damages. The adjuster set the amount at \$524.50. Mr. Williamson and I have agreed upon an amount of \$544.50, which I would recommend that we accept. As to William J. Williamson, personally, his original claim was \$1,180.35. The adjuster estimated the damage to be \$364.60. Mr. Williamson and I have been able to agree upon a figure of \$472.55. I would recommend that we pay this figure. As to the damaged suffered by Jeanee Williamson, the amount claimed was \$1,496.75. The adjuster set the damage at \$555.00. We have been able to agree on the amount of \$1,093.75, which I would recommend we accept.

If you have any further questions as to any of these figures, I would suggest that you contact me and we will go over the same. I promised both Mr. Williamson and Mr. Greer that we would give this our prompt attention and if the City Commission is agreeable to a settlement on this basis, that we would attempt to be some time in January as the City Commission would not meet prior to that time.
