MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY HELD ON FEBRUARY 25, 1974

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, met in regular session at the City Hall, in said City, on the 25th day of February, 1974, at the hour of 7:30 P.M., Local Time. The meeting was called to order at 7:35 P.M., due to the absence of the Assistant City Clerk, Jo Ann Johnson read the minutes for February 15, 1974. The minutes were approved as read without any additions or corrections.

Mrs. Runyon, from Williams Hollow Road came before the Commission asking why water was not available to her. Mrs. Runyon stated that she had put her own lines in at a considerable cost.

After discussing the matter, Mayor Hambley instructed City Manager,
