1-74-013

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE ORDINANCE PASSED BY THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, JUNE 30, 1958 AND THE OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE ORDINANCE PASSED MAY 14, 1962, BY MODIFYING MINIMUM LICENSE FEES THEREUNDER PERTAINING TO OPERATORS OF FACILITIES FOR LOADING AND UNLOADING OF COAL, SAND, GRAVEL, OR A COMBINATION THEREOF: DEFINING TERMS: STATING LEGISLATIVE PURPOSE OF THE WITHIN AMENDMENT: PROVIDING METHOD OF PAYMENT OF LICENSE FEE MODIFIED BY THIS ORDINANCE: PROVIDING FOR THE ENFORCEMENT HEREOF BY THE INSPECTION OF RECORDS: PROVIDING EFFECTIVE DATES: AND REPEALING CLAUSE.

The Commission had a discussion upon the relative factors concerning the benefits to be derived from the Coal Dock:

3. The effect of this Ordinance on the Industries effected thereby were discussed.

Ordinance on file in Ordinance Book 2 in the City Clerk's Office.

The Commission had a discussion concerning the City's Insurance. Mayor Hambley suggested that the City should set up their own self-insurance on the Compensation and liability. No action was taken.

Gene Davis came before the Commission to report an open sewer across from where Harold Shockey lives.

Mayor Hambley instructed City Manager, Ayers Shortt to check on the sewer situation and to act on it.

Mayor Hambley and Gene Davis had a brief discussion concerning the Pikeville Athletic Field.

City Attorney, Larry Webster asked Mayor Hambley for permission for his independent baseball team to play on the Pikeville Athletic Field.

Mayor Hambley granted Larry Webster permission to do so.

City Attorney, Larry Webster stated that they have been having a problem with the Occupational Ordinance. City Attorney, Larry Webster stated that the Ordinance does not state that they have to pay in advance or payable in payments.

City Attorney, Larry Webster suggested that the City should draw up an Amendment to the Ordinance so the taxes would be payable in advance.

Mayor Hambley instructed City Attorney, Larry Webster to prepare an Amendment to the Occupational Ordinance.

City Attorney, Larry Webster stated that the Holloway Corporation still owes the City \$87,000.00. City Attorney, Larry Webster suggested that the City should take some procedure in collecting the money.

Mayor Hambley stated that the City agreed with them that they would pay in June of each year as they get their draw-downs.

City Attorney, Larry Webster stated that the Ordinance was not clearly stated. No action was taken.

City Manager, Ayers Shortt asked Mayor Hambley about the Agreement concerning the borings with the State Highway Department on the project south of the City with Mays Construction Company.

Mayor Hambley stated that the City was not going to pay that much money for (1) one single tap.

Mayor Hambley stated that the State Highway Department did say that the City should figure the expenses on tearing down and salvaging the buildings on Poor Farm.

Mayor Hambley stated that the City should get the total figure on their truck time and etc., to recover the costs from the State Highway Department.

The Commission had a discussion concerning the site for the New Fire Station.

Mayor Hambley instructed City Manager, Ayers Shortt and City Attorney, Larry Webster to meet with Herman Dotson to discuss a site for the Fire Station.
