

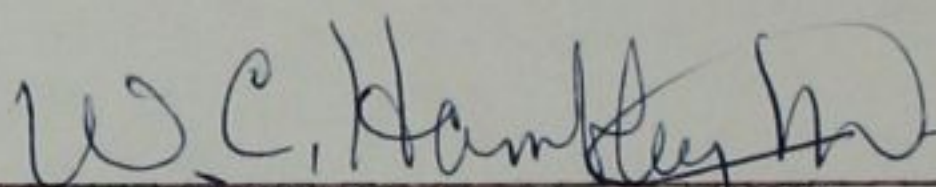

MINUTES - JUNE 24, 1974

At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville held in City Hall on June 24, 1974, at 7:30 P. M., the following members were present:

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 P. M., and began with the Assistant City Clerk reading minutes for the period from April 8, 1974 through April 26, 1974. The minutes were approved as read without any additions or corrections.

Circuit Judge, E. N. Venters and Reed B. Anderson came before the Commission concerning the Parking Tickets that are being issued to the Jurors.

Mayor Hambley stated that it was his understanding that as long as the Court provided the City with a list of the Jurors who were actually either serving or impounded that they would be eligible.

City Attorney, Larry Webster suggested that new cards be printed for each Juror to fill out at the beginning of the time of the Jury service indicating the name, license number of the car that will be used during the time of Jury Duty or the time their term expires.

Mayor Hambley stated that the City made two Agreements.

1. Direct Payment of the Deed.

2. An Ancillary Agreement to that which was still part of the total agreement in which the City agreed to reconstruct the sidewalk around the County building and also to give them area rights over the area that would be developed from Caroline Avenue to Division Street when this was developed and the City would maintain control of the ground level parking. If they build a building over this area as part of their area rights, the City would provide the piers on which the building would be constructed.

Mayor Hambley stated that this Agreement would solve the parking problem for the County Courts and Circuit Courts.



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After a lengthy discussion Mayor Hambley instructed City Manager, Ayers Shortt to work the situation out.

Mrs. Anderson, Truman Williams and several other citizens of the City of Pikeville came before the Commission concerning a sewer problem on Cline Street. Mr. Williams stated that the sewer has been running continuously from the house behind the Pinson house.

Mrs. Anderson asked Mayor Hambley how long it would be until the people on the other side of the river from Cline Street would be connected on to the sewage.

Mayor Hambley stated that the sewers will have to be connected on as soon as the Housing Project is approved.

After a lengthy discussion Mayor Hambley instructed City Manager, Ayers Shortt to have the sewer behind the Edmonds Apartment and on Cline Street fixed.

Commissioner Thomas Howell asked why the construction on Kentucky Avenue has not been started.

City Manager, Ayers Shortt stated that the engineer has not completed the plans on the construction. Mr. Shortt also stated that the job would be contracted out for the sidewalks road, streets and water and gas lines.

Commissioner Robert Amos, Jr., stated that several people on Chloe Creek and Ferguson Creek are on the City's water system but do not have the sewer service.

Mayor Hambley stated that if the people have their own well and the City annexes them its still mandatory to use a sewer. Therefore, the City would have to meter them at 85 per cent.

After a brief discussion Mayor Hambley instructed City Manager, Ayers Shortt to make a survey to find out how many people needs to hook on the sewer system.

Garbage bill from Pike Enterprises was presented in the amount of \$ 1,766.00.

City Manager, Ayers Shortt recommended that the bill for the amount of \$ 1, 766.00 not be paid. Mr. Shortt stated that Pike Enterprises were supposed to send him a letter informing the City that they were going to raise to \$1.00 a yard but they did not do so. No action was taken.

Mayor Hambley stated that Columbia Gas Company has informed the City that come November there would be an 8 cents increase in gas.

Mayor Hambley stated that the City is going to have to take action to raise for that which the City have already been raised. Mayor Hambley stated that the City's only option is to increase the rates to our customers by the amount it is increased to the City.

After a brief discussion Mayor Hambley instructed City Attorney, Larry Webster to prepare an Ordinance to increase the customers rates to 12 cents and bring it to the next meeting.

City Manager, Ayers Shortt presented to the Commission a letter from South Central Bell concerning the amount monthly or yearly which would allow their service vehicles to park downtown without being tagged. No action was taken.
