We noticed that the fuse box in the garage is missing its cover. Also, one of the fuses keeps shorting out so there was some temporary rearranging of some of the wires. It is recommended that a qualified electrician repair this and replace the cover to prevent electrocutions or possible fires from shorts or build up dust.

On my next visit to Pikeville, I will be looking forward to working with you and Bob to discuss the future development of your safety program. #### AGREEMENT FOR MINING RIGHTS

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 10 day of October, 1974 by and between THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, hereinafter called the CITY, and HOL-ACC CORPORATION, hereinafter called the COMPANY.

WHEREAS, the City is the owner of certain surface properties lying within the Watershed of Cole Hollow in Pike County, Kentucky, and;

WHEREAS, the Company is undertaking the mining of said property by lawful surface mining methods, and;

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the parties hereto by this Instrument for the City to grant to the Company the right to enter upon the surface and to mine the said property on certain terms and conditions more specifically set forth hereinafter,

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein the parties do hereby agree as follows:

1. The City hereby grants to the Company the right to enter upon and to conduct lawful surface mining of the coal underlying the property owned by the City on the Watershed of Cole Hollow, in Pike County, Kentucky.

2. The Company shall not deposit overburden or mining refuse on the said property except by doing so at the direction of, and according to the instructions of the City, its duly authorized agents, servants, employees, or engineers.

3. The City agrees to provide the Company with specifications for the placing of overburden, topsoil, and refuse, upon the said property, which shall be done by the Company in accordance with such specifications.

4. The Company shall faithfully perform all requirements imposed upon them by State, Federal, or Local Mining Laws, and shall save the City free and harmless from any and all claims of liability to third parties by virtue of the Company's mining of the said property.

5. The right of the City to use, develop, and enjoy its surface property shall be paramount to the rights granted to the Company herein.

6. The City will accept the foregoing consideration, to-wit, the right to control the disposition of topsoil, overburden, and refuse, in full settlement of any and all surface damage done to the said property by the Company, so long as the Company is lawfully conducting its mining operations.

### LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 14 day of October 1974, by and between the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, a Municipal corporation of Kentucky (hereinafter referred to as the "Municipality") and the Housing Authority of Pikeville, a public body and a body corporate and politic existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky (hereinafter referred to as the "Local Authority");

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Local Authority is developing, with financial assistance of the United States of America (hereinafter referred to as the "GOVERNMENT"), pursuant to the provisions of the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, a low-rent housing project known as Project KY-107-1 (hereinafter called the "Project") located in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, for operation pursuant to the terms and conditions of Annual Contributions Contract No. A-2077, with the Government, dated December 30, 1970, and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of Pikeville, as a benefit to and for the residents of the Project, as a necessary appurtenance thereto, desires to provide community, maintenance, and management spaces adequate to serve such needs of the Project and its residents, and

WHEREAS, the Municipality holds title to all of that tract or parcel of land and the improvements thereon located in the City of Pikeville, Pike County, Kentucky, described as follows:

Located between street parallel to the U. S. 23 Bypass route and the Levisa Fork of the Big Sandy River, and being that property known as the Perry A. Cline School Building, together with the entire tract of land occupied by the said buildings, and

WHEREAS, the Local Authority desires to renovate and furnish a portion of the said Perry O. Cline school building for the purpose of providing community, maintenance, and management spaces to serve such needs of the Project and its residents, and

WHEREAS, the Local Authority desires to obtain from the Municipality adequate assurance that that portion of the said building which the Local Authority may renovate and furnish will be available for use by the Local Authority, the Project, and the residents of the Project continuously throughout the life of the Annual Contributions Contract, and
