#### SUPPLEMENT TO CONTRACT FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES SEWERAGE WORKS IMPROVEMENTS CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY

WITNESSETH, that HOWARD K. BELL, CONSULTING ENGINEERS, INC. has been engaged to provide engineering services to determine sewerage system needs and alternatives through comprehensive planning for Pikeville 201 Planning Area under the terms and conditions of a Contract for Engineering Services dated October 28, 1974, with the CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY, and,

WHEREAS, one of the conditions of the U.C. Environmental Protection Agency agreement is that the Engineering Contract include certain language not included in the aforementioned contract, and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire of both the ENGINEER and the CITY that said Engineering Contract be brought into conformance with the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises and by mutual consent, the aforementioned Contract for Engineering Services is hereby supplemented by the addition of the following statement:

> "REPRESENTATIVES OF EPA AND THE ATATE WILL HAVE ACCESS TO THE WORK WHENEVER IT IS IN PREPARATION OR PROGRESS. THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY REGIONAL ADMINISTRATOR, THE COMPTROLLER GENERAL OF THE UNITED STATES, OR ANY AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE SHALL HAVE ACCESS TO ANY BOOKS, DOCUMENTS, PAPERS , AND RECORDS WHICH ARE PERTINENT TO THE PROJECT FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING AUDIT, EXAMINATION, EXCERPTS, AND TRANSCRIP-TIONS THEREOF."

Except as supplemented herein the aforementioned Contract for Engineering Services remains in full force and effect.

Resolution R-75-18 was presented and read as follows:

R-75-18

RESOLUTION ASSURING THE FEDERAL INSURANCE ADMINISTRATION OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM REGULATIONS AND VESTING THE CITY BUILDING AND CODES ADMINISTRATOR WITH CERTAIN RESPONSIBILITIES PERTINENT THEREUNTO.

WHEREAS, certain areas of Pikeville, Kentucky are subject to periodic flooding and/or mud slides from the Big Sandy River and its tributaries, including, but not limited to, Island Creek, Harolds Branch, Chloe Creek, Ferguson Creek, Cedar Creek, and Ratliffs Creed, causing serious damages to properties within these areas; and,

WHEREAS, relief is available in the form of federally subsidized flood insurance as authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968; and,

WHEREAS, it is the intention of this Commission to require the recognition and evaluation of flood and/or mud slide hazards in all official actions relating to land use in the flood plain and/or mud slide areas having special flood and/or mud slide hazards; and,

WHEREAS, this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures to reduce future flood losses pursuant to KRS Chapter 100, the Housing and Unsafe Buildings Codes adopted by the City of Pikeville July 3, 1967, and the Zoning Ordinance for the City of Pikeville, adopted February 12, 1972.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Commission of Pikeville, Kentucky hereby:

1. Assures the Federal Insurance Administration that it will enact as necessary, and maintain in force for those areas having flood or mud slide hazards, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the Criteria set forth in Section 1910 of the National flood Insurance Program Regulations; and

2. Vests the Pikeville Building and Codes Administrator, sometimes called the Building officer with the responsibility, authority, and means to;

(a) Delineate or assist the Administrator, at his request, in delineating the limits of the areas having special flood and/or mud slide hazards on available local maps of sufficient scale to identify the location of the building site.

(b) Provide such information that the Administrator may request concerning present uses and occupancy of the flood plain and/or mud slide area.

(c) Cooperate with Federal, State or local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map, and identify flood plain or mud slide areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining flood plain and/or mud slide areas in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.

(d) Submit on the anniversary date of the Community's initial eligiblity and annual report to the Administrator on the progress made during the past year within the community and the development and implementation of flood plain and/or mud slide area of management measures.

3. Appoints the Pikeville Building and Codes Administrator to maintain for public inspection and furnish upon request a record of elevations (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest floor (including basements) of all new or substantially improved structures located in the special flood hazard area. If the lowest floor is below grade on one or more side, the elevation of the floor is below grade on one or more side, the floor immediately above must also be recorded.

4. Agrees to take such other official actions as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program.
