

## MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

## REGULAR MEETING - OCTOBER 27, 1975

At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in City Hall on October 27, 1975, at 7:30 P.M. the following members were present:

Mayor Pro-Tem Robert Amos, Jr. called the meeting to order at 7:35 P.M.

The Assistant City Clerk read the minutes for the period of October 13, 1975, and October 16, 1975. The minutes were approved with the exception of the purchase of Harvey Robinsons' equipment. The Commission said they will advertise for bid on the purchase of a used roller and spreader.

Juanita Cox came before the Commission concerning an alley between her property and Homer Robinsons' property. The alley falls between Cline Street and Robinson Street. She stated that the alley was not in operational use and she desired the property be given back to the owners, which consisted of 5 feet on each side.

Mayor Pro-Tem Robert Amos, Jr. asked City Attorney, Larry Webster, to check into the deed of this alley.

Mrs. Cox also requested that a storm sewer be remove from her back yard. City Manager, Ayers Shortt, said that would not be possible because of it being a main drain.

Dr. W.C. Ratliff came before the Commission concerning water taps for his trailer park on Harold's Branch. He requested 1 master tap with 12 meters running behind the trailers. He would buy the 12 meters and the pipe and have them placed in to connect the master meter.

Mayor Hambley arrived at 8:00 P.M.

After a lengthy discussion, Mayor Hambley said the City Ordinance requires that each household have a separate water tap and he would have to place 12 separate meters @ 112.50 a meter.

Commissioner Robert Amos, Jr. made the motion to make the tap and connect the 12 meters to each lot @ 112.50 per meter. Commissioner Thomas Howell second the motion.

Mayor Hambley stated the need for an easement before the line could be run to the meters. Dr. Ratliff agreed to draw up the easement.

Commissioner Robert Amos, Jr. brought up the condition of the proposed parking lot on Hellier Street. He said the houses needed to be torn down for parking space. He asked Robert Johnson, Director of the Housing Authority, when these houses would be torn down. Mr. Johnson said they were in the process.

Mayor Hambley told City Manager, Ayers Shortt, to check into this and try to get something fix up for the Christmas shoppers.

Odell Rogers, Captain of the Volunteer Firemen, came before the Commission concerning the placement of Christmas lights throughout the City. He said the charge for the project would be \$900.00.

Commissioner Willie Joe Meade made the motion for the Volunteer Firemen to place the lights in their prospective places beginning November 3, 1975, for \$900.00. Commissioner Robert Easton second the motion.

Residents from Williams Hollow came before the Commission to state that they were working on the petition for annexation, and that it would be ready by the next regular meeting of the Commission.

Robert Gidney, representative from Heath & Associates, presented a report on the over-all design of the renewal of the gas system for the City of Pikeville. With a map showing the proposed system, he stated that approximately 48 miles of gas distribution mains comprised of 6", 4", and 2" steel pipe and 4", 3", 2", and 1 1/4" plastic pipe; 22 miles of 3/4" plastic service pipe plus other appurtenances as described in the Contract documents. He recommended to the Commission, that when the City advertised for bid on the construction of the project, that we bid for total construction instead of doing the project in phases.

Commissioner Robert Easton made the motion to give authorization to prepare documents and to advertise for bid on total construction for the proposed gas system. Commissioner Willie Joe Meade second the motion.
