REGULAR MEETING - DECEMBER 8, 1975

At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in City Hall on December 8, 1975, at 7:30 P.M., the following members were present:

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 P.M.

The Assistant City Clerk read the minutes for the period of November 24, 1975, and December 1, 1975. The minutes were approved as read without any additions or corrections.

Discussion opened up on the Gas Distribution Renewal

System.

Ralph Nall, representative of Dupree & Company, presented the estimated cost and sources of funds to the Commission. Estimated cost for the first year would be \$2,385,000.00; source of funds for this would be the Revenue Bonds. The estimated required net annual revenues from the operation of our gas system would have to be \$376,500.00. Our estimated annual expenses for 1975 + 5% would be \$516,000.00; so the required gas sales gross revenues would have to be \$892,500.00.

Mr. Nall stated that this was not an easy bond to sale; and they need the assurance of the lifetime of the local gas reserves and an agreement from Columbia Gas.

Ed Nosow, engineer in gas field reserves, spoke before the Commission about his work and what it entails. He stated that he could work up an estimate of our local gas reserves for a minimum of \$2,500.00.

Mayor Hambley stated that we needed to have this information on hand; whether we sold bonds or not. He asked Mr. Nosow to draw a proposal up between him and The City of Pikeville.

Robert Gidney, representative from Heath & Associates, presented a bid summary of the Gas Distribution System to the Commission. Mr. Gidney made the point that construction for this job is very difficult and that these bids are competent for the job that is to be done. Mr. Heath stated that

which ever way the City chooses to go, Heath and Associates would be with them 100%.

Heath and Associates will meet with the City's Bond Agent and see if they can come up with a halfway margin; and present a purposal at a future meeting.

Mr. Gidney made the Commission aware that the bids will expire December 25, 1975.

Resolution R-75-76 was presented and read entitled:

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY ACCEPTING A PROPOSAL OF DUPREE & COMPANY, INC. LEXINGTON, KENTUCKY TO ACT AS FISCAL AGENT IN THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF CITY OF PIKEVILLE, NATURAL GAS SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS.

WHEREAS, The City of Pikeville, (Hereinafter the City) is presently considering the repair and reconstruction of its natural gas distribution system (hereinafter the "System"); and

WHEREAS, the City does not presently have sufficient funds available to accomplish such repair and reconstruction; and

WHEREAS, the City proposes to issur its City of Pikeville Natural Gas System Revenue Bonds in an amount as yet undertermined but sufficient to pay the const of such repair and construction as is determined to be feasible; and

WHEREAS, Dupree & Company, Inc., a licensed Municipal Bond Dealer with offices in the City of Lexington, Kentucky, has presented a proposal to the City to act as Fiscal Agent in providing consultation, advice and professional services in the preparation and offering for sale of such a bond issue, such proposal being as follows:

Honorable W.C. Hambley, M.D. Mayor -and-Members of the City Commission Pikeville, Kentucky

Gentlemen:

We are advised that the City of Pikeville (hereinafter the "City") is considering the repair and reconstruction of its natural gas distribution system and the issuance of bonds to provide funds for such repair and reconstruction.

We understand that the City desires to obtain the services of a Fiscal Agent in the issuance of such bonds. Dupree & Company, Inc., (hereinafter the "Fical Agent") presents the following proposal:

- 1. The Fiscal Agent will prepare and cause to be offered for sale in a manner provided by law an issue of the City's Bonds in an amount to be determined by the City.
- 2. The Fiscal Agent will consider and submit recommendations to the City on matters related to the issuance of Bonds including, but not limited to: size of issue, date of issue, schedule of Bond maturities, prior redemption provisions, denomination, place or places of payment, control and disposition of Bond proceeds and revenues, accumulation of desireable reserves and timing of Bond sale.
- 3. The Fiscal Agent will retain the services of nationally recognized Bond Counsel who will draft all Ordinances and other required legal documents and will render a final opinion on the legality of the Bonds and all proceedings in connection therewith.
- 4. The Fiscal Agent will assist the City in the preparation of an Official Statement setting forth a proper description of the Bond issue, including finan-

cial and other information such as investors and prospective bidders require in evaluating Bonds and instructions for submitting proposals to purchase Bonds.

- 5. The Fiscal Agent will advise in the tabulation and comparison of bids received and will submit recommendations concerning the acceptability of such proposals from the standpoint of price and interest cost in relation to financial conditons existing at the time.
- 6. The Fiscal Agent, in cooperation with Bond Counsel, will examine the Bonds prior to delivery to determine that they are accurate in text, dating and maturity. The Fiscal Agent will assist in the execution and delivery of the Bonds.
- 7. The Fiscal Agent agrees that from the stipulated compensation the following expenses will be paid:
 - (a) Travel, telephone, hotel, subsistence, and other expenses incurred in the performance of its functions under this agreement;
 - (b) The fees and expenses of Bond Counsel retained by the Fiscal Agent;
 (c) The cost of soliciting proposals to purchase the Bonds in such manner
 - as Bond Counsel advises may be required by Law;

 (d) The cost of having all Bonds prepared in customary and acceptable printed or lithographed form on steel engraved borders by a nationally known firm specializing in the preparation of Bonds, and the cost incurred in the execution thereof and delivery to the Purchasers;
 - (e) The cost of printing, mimeographing, or otherwise reproducing in multiple copies, the City's prospectus or other official statement such as is customary or desirable;
 - (f) The cost of disseminating copies of publicity material to a mailing list of institutions and dealers generally known to be actively interested in the type of Bond concerned;
- 8. For the above services and expenses, the Fiscal Agent is to receive payment from the proceeds of the Bonds simultaneously with the delivery of the Bonds to the purchaser(s) to be calculated as a percentage of the face amount of Bonds issued in accordance with the following schedule:

2% of the first \$500,000 or \$7,500 whichever is greater; 1 1/2% of the next \$500,000 1% of the amount over \$1,000,000.

- 9. The City agrees to furnish:
- (a) The services of the City Attorney as required without charge:

 (b) Report from Design Engineer stating in reasonable detail (i) work to be done; (ii) total cost of project to completion; (iii) estimated annual gas usuage for each year until final maturity of Bonds; (iv) estimated annual revenues and expenses for each year until final maturity of the Bonds: (v) any other pertinent information:

of the Bonds; (v) any other pertinent information;

(c) Report from independent engineering consultant reciting the opinion that gas available under existing contracts will be adequate to to produce revenues sufficient to pay maintenance and operations costs and principal of and interest on the Bonds through final maturity.

10. The City agrees that in the event that the Fiscal Agent renders the services as stated herein to the point that bids are solicited for the Bonds and, the City rejects all bids received, then the Fiscal Agent is entitled to payment from the City of actual out-of-pocket expenses up to a maximum of \$1,500.00 upon submission of an itemized statement of such expenses.
