## REGULAR MEETING - APRIL 25, 1977

Ordinance 1-77-003 was presented and read entitled:

ORDINANCE PROHIBITING  
PARKING IN LOADING ZONES  
FROM 8:00 A.M. TO 5:00 P.M.,  
UNTIL AUGUST 1, 1977.

WHEREAS, the recent flooding in Pikeville has severely depleted the stock of retail merchants in their stores, necessitating an influx of trucks and other vehicles using loading zones to restock the said merchandise,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that parking in loading zones by anyone other than commercial vehicles loading or unloading merchandise is prohibited from 8:00 a.m., until 5:00 p.m., each day until August 1, 1977 following which time the hours of loading zone use shall be returned to the existing times.

The fine for violation of the within Ordinance shall be the same fine heretofore imposed by Ordinance for illegal parking in a loading zone.

An emergency is declared to exist with regard to the foregoing Ordinance and the same shall be in full force and effect immediately upon subscription and approval of same.

At Pikeville, Kentucky this 25th day of April, 1977.

I have no intentions of interfering with the management of the City as I have every reason to believe that Mr. Bowen is well qualified to manage the City after he has had the time and opportunity to observe the different facets of the operations of the City and also its personnel.

I am sure that Mr. Bowen has not had the time or opportunity to observe the different facets of operations or tis personnel as he has been very busy in the cleanup of the City from the flood.

I feel that Mr. Bowen should at his discretion make whatever changes in personnel both supervisory and labor as he sees fit, without any interference from the governing body of the City except when this Commission feels that management has made a discriminatory decision. I then feel it is the Commissions duty or obligation to call it to the managements attention.

I personally feel that it was discriminatory when management ask one of the foremen not to use the City vehicle for transportation to and from work anymore but let the other foreman continue to use the City vehicle of which he drives for the same purpose.

THEREFORE: I make a motion that neither of the foremen use a City vehicle for transportation to and from work. I have never felt that anyone other than the Superintendent and men on trouble call should take the City vehicles home at night.

Hall Contracting Corporation requested a reduction in retainage on their next periodic estimate from ten percent (10%) to Two percent (2%).
