WHEREAS, the City of Pikeville provides uniforms for its police officers to wear when on duty and,

WHEREAS said uniforms require frequent dry cleaning and,

WHEREAS the City Commission insists that police officers uniforms be kept in first class condition in order to maintain a first class public image of our Police Department and Community for the pride of local residents as well as an indication to visitors of the Community's pride in itself, and,

WHEREAS the City Commission in June 1978 did agree to pay police officers a \$10 per payday - \$20 per month uniform maintenance allowance and did include funds for said allowance in both the 1978-79 and the 1979-80 budgets.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Pikeville Bookkeeper and City Clerk are hereby authorized to prepare and issue checks quarterly to uniformed Police Officers for their budgeted uniform cleaning and maintenance allowance without requiring their inclusion amoung the Vouchers Payable approved monthly by the City Commission.
