

CONTINUED MEETING - MAY 30, 1985

The Pikeville City Commission met in a continued session on May 30, 1985 in the Old City Hall Meeting Room on Division Street.

Mayor W. C. Hambley, M.D. presided over the meeting and called it to order at 4:10 p.m. The following members were present:

Pat Blayney, Engineer for the proposed water treatment plant, explained alternatives available to construct the water treatment plant which bid in at 1.3 million over budget. Mr. Blayney felt that 2.2 million in additional funds need to be requested from FmHA to build the plant and make necessary repairs to the Raw Water Intake (\$440,000 - \$650,000 estimated). Rates will have to be revised from H.J. Umbaugh's figures to cover the additional funds required. Customer rates are proposed at \$7.55 per minimum bill. Water District rates will range from \$1.28 per thousand to \$1.34 per thousand. Mr. Blayney cautioned the Commission that in rejecting the bids, the Raw Water Intake repairs will have to be included in the new bid documents before FmHA will consider granting the additional funds required. The interest rate will be fixed at 9.5%. Commissioner Page suggested having Dupree & Company shop the bonds. Frank Moris made the motion to reject all bids and proceed with the upgrading of the Raw Water Intake. Harding Dawahare seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Sue Smallwood, Community Development Fiscal Coordinator, presented a budget revision for approval where \$4,826.00 would be transferred from Administration of the Water Treatment Plant to the Toler Gap Storage Tank account. Harding Dawahare made the motion, seconded by Robert Page to approve the revision. The motion carried 4 - 0.

Upon recommendation by Police Chief, Eugene Edmonds, Robert Page made the motion, seconded by Frank Morris to employ Donald H.W. Burns as patrolan for the City of Pikeville. The motion carried unanimously.

Robert Page made the motion to adjourn the meeting. Harding Dawahare seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.
