

COMMERCIAL DISTRICT: DESCRIPTION

Only three structures from Pikeville's early commercial development remain in the downtown. (PiP 14, PiP 18, PiP 21). They are all on the west side of Main Street occupying lots from the original plat of the town. Their position there close to the courthouse and 300 feet from the Big Sandy River coincides with the navigational efforts on the river at that time. Steamboats used this route to carry goods from Ashland on the Ohio River to Pikeville when the water level permitted. Efforts to finance a series of locks to free the steamboats from their seasonal restraints failed and the river traffic waned during the first decade of the twentieth century.

Despite alterations to their first floor facades, these three buildings contribute a sense of scale and history to Main Street which would otherwise be lost. Their rectangular barn-like form is a result of the variety of hardware, dry goods, and groceries that were sold on the premises. These three buildings were also associated with early Pikeville entrepreneurs such as J.E. Yost, Hibbard Williamson, Orlando Bowles, and Harrison Ford. Bowles and Yost returned from service in the Union Army to open their general stores in Pikeville. This original cluster of retailing started Pikeville on the road to becoming the regional retail trade center that it is today.

Since the growth of steamboat traffic was hampered by unreliable water levels, the river trade gave way to the railroads. The first decade of the twentieth century saw Pikeville finally linked to Ashland by rail. This new transportation stimulated the mineral industries and created a need for additional office space in the downtown.

Retailing was transformed from general stores to more specialized commercial ventures. Four buildings were built in the downtown during this period which exemplify the times. (PiP 12, PiP 13, PiP 16, PiP 17) These structures differ from the earlier commercial buildings in their detailing, especially the brick corbelling. They are three stories, flat roofed, and display a greater percentage of glass in their facades than the earlier buildings. The Anthony Hotel is four stories and was only recently surpassed in height by the First National Bank.


In 1927, the Day and Night Bank (PiP 15) was built on the corner of Main and Division. It exhibits the only sandstone facade left in Pikeville. Despite an unsympathetic second story addition, it remains an asset to the Main Street streetscape by virtue of the shallow relief created by pilasters and arches.

COMMERCIAL DISTRICT: SIGNIFICANCE

The Commercial District contains buildings created by two distinct transportation eras in Pikeville's development. In such rugged topography, transportation controlled communication, availability of finished goods, and access to new technology. The three early dry goods stores are Pikeville's best examples of mid-19th century

commercial buildings related to early settlement of the town and river trade. The other commercial buildings within the district are Pikeville's best examples of early 20th century commercial buildings created by the arrival of the railroad and the first coal boom.

COMMERCIAL DISTRICT: BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION

Beginning at the southwest corner of Pikeville Drug (Anthony Hotel); proceeding east 100 feet along the southwest facade of Pikeville Drug to a point; turning north at the southeast corner of Pikeville Drug and proceeding 135 feet along the east side of facades facing Main Street to a point; crossing Division Street 40 feet, continuing north along Main 210 feet to the northeast corner of the Caudill Building; then turning west 60 feet along the north side of the Caudill Building to a point; then turning south 120 feet to the southwest corner of the old Masonic Hall (PiP 20); then turning east 10 feet to a point; then proceeding south 30 feet along the west facade of 335 Main to a point; then turning east 20 feet to a point in the south facade of 335 Main; then turning south and proceeding 60 feet along the west facade of the Bowles Building; crossing Division 38 feet to a point in the north facade of the old Day and Night Bank; then turning northwest 130 feet with the north facades of the commercial buildings to the northwest corner of 105 Division Street; turning south 50 feet with the west facade of 105 Division Street to the southwest corner of said building; turning southeast 45 feet to the southeast corner of 105 Division; then turning south 60 feet to the southwest corner of the adjacent building; turning southeast 40 feet to a point in the west facade of Murphey's building; then 50 feet south along the west facade of Pikeville Drug to the point of beginning.

COMMERCIAL DISTRICT: JUSTIFICATION

The Commercial District described above contains 12 buildings of which are defined non contributin by virtue of their construction style or materials. The district is bordered on the east across Main Street by the Pike County Courthouse, already on the National Register and the First National Bank, a modern building, and parking lots. On the north are modern commercial buildings without distinct architectural merit. The commercial buildings on the west and south are vernacular in style and not of the same construction quality as the ones included in the district.
