CITY OF PIKEVILLE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING MINUTES June 14, 2021 AT 6:00 P.M.

The Board of Commissioners for the City of Pikeville met in a regular called session on Monday, June 14, 2021. The meeting was held at City Hall, 243 Main Street, Pikeville, KY 41501.

The minutes for the previous regular meeting held on May 24, 2021 were in each Commissioner's agenda package. There being no additions or corrections, Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve the minutes as prepared. Commissioner Powers seconded the motion. Mayor Jimmy Carter called for discussion, there being none, the motion carried unanimously. 4-0.
